Thank you for your patience and support these past few months as Temple Shalom closed its doors to mitigate the spread of the corona virus



to our members and the community at large.

Recently the governor finally deemed it safe for houses of worship to re-open its doors. As a result, the Board of Directors met on Zoom and decided to open Temple Shalom for Shabbat services only for the time being.

As of this writing we will not have had our first Shabbat in the building yet, but as of today, we will have installed the new slate of officers of both Sisterhood and the Temple at our first Shabbat since we re-opened. Thank you to all those who volunteer their time and effort to make Temple Shalom so successful. We look forward to working with these new Boards to continue the mission of Temple Shalom.

Saturday morning services will continue, for the time being, on the first Saturday of each month at 11:00 a.m. both at the synagogue and live streamed on Facebook. OUR SERVICES WILL BE OPEN TO OUR CONGREGANTS/MEMBERS AND THEIR SPOUSES OR PARTNERS ONLY, NO GUESTS (INCLUDING VISITING FAMILY MEMBERS) OR NON-MEMBERS WILL BE ADMITTED. The health and safety of our members is our main priority, therefore we have developed strict guidelines that must be followed.

In addition, the Rabbi Search Committee, chaired by our Vice President Marc Kaplan, has been hard at work interviewing several prospective Rabbis for both High Holidays and beyond. You will be receiving more information via email once the committee has made its recommendation and a decision has been made.

We will continue to work and plan future events and activities on your behalf to ensure that we can ultimately return to Temple Shalom stronger and more connected than ever.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR THE RE-OPENING OF TEMPLE SHALOM**

The following guidelines for holding services will be in addition to the CDC guidelines of social distancing, maintaining a distance of six feet apart at all times, no gathering in the building, no hugging, no handshaking, no physical contact of any kind:

- <u>Face masks</u>: Must be worn <u>PROPERLY</u> (covering the mouth and nose completely) at all times. You are asked and encouraged to bring your own masks, but we will have a <u>limited</u> supply of face masks if you forget to bring your own; gloves are optional.
- <u>Seats</u>: Will be set up six feet apart in groups of one or two (to allow couples to sit together). Two people sitting together must be of the same family. **DO NOT MOVE ANY CHAIRS.**
- <u>Prayer Books, Kippot, Tallit</u>: We will not be using our prayer books, kippot or tallit, please bring your own from home. Paper copies of the script for each service (the same one that was previously emailed to you) will be provided for each congregant who attends and you will be expected to bring it with you each time you attend services.
- <u>Building maintenance</u>: The building, seats, and surfaces will be cleaned/sanitized after each service by our cleaning person.
- <u>Wipes and sanitizer</u>: Will be located at each door and bathroom for your convenience and safety. You are asked and encouraged to bring your own as well.
- <u>Live Stream</u>: A tripod will be set up facing the bimah. Michelle Foels will be recording and live streaming services for us. Live streaming will be **Temporary**.
- Onegs: **The kitchen will be closed.** Please bring your own water from home and take your bottle home with you. No onegs will be held during this time. The service leader will perform the Kiddush from the bimah.

## Health and Safety: DO NOT ATTEND SERVICES IF YOU DO NOT FEEL WELL FOR ANY REASON, COVID RELATED OR NOT!

Please know that Temple Shalom is firmly committed to protecting the health and safety of our members. We look forward to greeting you in person as we begin to get back to a new normal.

#### Sisterhood News – July 2020

On March 15, 2020, the Board of Directors of Temple Shalom passed a motion regarding the membership of our auxiliary organizations. The exact wording of the motion is as follows: "A person may be a member of an auxiliary and not be a member of Temple Shalom for one fiscal year. After that, if not a member in good standing of Temple Shalom, the person may no longer participate in the auxiliary organization. Their membership will be for the remainder of the fiscal year in which they joined, starting July 1. A person who is a spouse/partner of someone who is a member in good standing of Temple Shalom is exempt from the one year limit of non-Temple membership."

Our current fiscal year is about to end, and as a result, the above new rules will be in effect beginning July 1, 2020.

What does this mean for current members of Sisterhood? The answer: for those who are Temple Shalom members or a spouse/partner of a Temple Shalom member in good standing, nothing changes.

However, if you are not a member of Temple Shalom, this means that as of July 1, 2020, you have one year you can remain a Sisterhood member. At the end of the coming fiscal year (ending on June 30, 2021) you must decide whether or not to become a member of Temple Shalom. If you do not join, you will not be able to continue your Sisterhood membership.

The following is an explanation of why we passed this policy:

The Sisterhood of Temple Shalom exists as an auxiliary organization of Temple Shalom. It was established within the synagogue, to be an extension of Temple membership for its female members. It is meant to be a first step toward Temple leadership. Its programs are meant to benefit the Temple first and foremost, and the greater Jewish community thereafter.

Our hope has always been that non-Temple members of Sisterhood would ultimately join Temple Shalom, but that has not happened to the degree hoped. When a person becomes a Temple member, that person becomes a part of our family, investing themselves in the synagogue's future success. The Temple Shalom Board also feels that Temple membership should have some benefits/privileges that its non-members do not have and therefore has changed its policy. Mickie Feiden
