A Message from the Presidents

It seems that our lives are littered with symbols. Many of them are the guideposts by which we live. We need to remember to look to these symbols as the lights of our future from the lights of our past. The Hanukkah candles we just finished lighting are a symbol. During the week of Hanukkah, several of our congregants took the opportunity to light candles together. Not only was it a reminder that we are a community, but it was a beautiful way to remember who we are.



Temple Shalom is a Jewish leader in Myrtle Beach and has been for the past 15 years.

Since our inception, we have encountered many obstacles in our coming of age. When we were able to have our own home, it was the culmination of many years of moving, shaking, and life changing moments. We already had seen a group adult Bat/Bar Mitzvah, our Rabbi developed our religious practices to increase our Jewish meaning, we had Mah Jongg marathons, movie nights, Sisterhood and Brotherhood groups provided the social experiences so valuable to synagogue life and much, much more. The past year has been difficult and challenging, but we have prevailed. We have had some past members choose to leave us for a variety of reasons, but every year we see some changes in membership. We have experimented successfully with Rabbi Emeritus David Weissman leading our very successful High Holiday services. We started virtual Facebook streamed Shabbat evening services which attract people from all over, often seeing 75-100 hits per week. We now offer a monthly Adult Education program. Rabbi Weissman has volunteered his time and energy to bring us back into weekly morning Shabbat services. Sisterhood continues to provide fundraisers, programs and support to our members.

What does it all mean? The Hanukkah lights were a miracle but they also symbolize our continuity. For thousands of years, Jews have lit Hanukkah lights to ensure that our light continues to burn. At one of the Hanukkah lightings, Flo read a piece about how Holocaust victims managed to light the lights of Hanukkah in work and death camps, even in the dead of winter. Although Chanukah is a relatively minor Jewish holiday, it has gained prominence in recent generations because of its major implications. Chanukah speaks to a deep need we have to shed a bit of light.

We, as the members of Temple Shalom of Myrtle Beach, hope to keep the light of Reform Judaism alive in Myrtle Beach. Let us rededicate ourselves to stay involved, attend virtual services and events, and show our support to our community and congregation. We hold out the faith that if we can get through the present darkness, the light of spring will arrive and we will be renewed. This year, there is even more meaning in the promise of spring, when we can once again enjoy outdoor events that allow for social distancing to keep us safe(r); and the promise of treatments and a vaccine that will eventually allow us to embrace without fear.

We <u>will</u> re-open our building. We <u>will</u> resume "regular operations" as soon as possible, but not until our leadership and membership feel safe coming to our Temple. Until then, keep safe and healthy and know that we are here for you.


