A Message from Your Presidents

As we celebrate Passover and welcome spring, it is hard to realize that for the past year, Temple Shalom has been a virtual Temple. We were unable to have our annual Community Seder last year because the pandemic was so new and startling. Our Board, particularly the Executive Board, was in the



midst of a Rabbi search. We needed to get up to snuff on the Zoom and Facebook technology to continue our congregation. Thank you Michelle Foels and Shelley Foels for helping us develop Zoom and Facebook platforms and monitoring and managing them so we could continue to at least touch base every Friday night. It was very lonely at the Temple, just Michelle, Cookie, Laurie, and Lily Ann. 

After 27 years managing the Sunset Beach Pier and Island Market, Becky and Marc Kaplan are ready to retire and take a few vacations of their own.

Longtime pier operators ready to retire, take RV into sunset years

SUNSET BEACH — After nearly three decades running the Sunset Beach Pier, Marc and Becky Kaplan are making plans to enjoy their own sunset years.

The longtime owner/operators of the Sunset Beach Pier store and Island Market on Sunset Boulevard recently "sold out" — selling their ownership in their two stores as they make plans to retire in coming months.

"This whole thing has

been love," Marc said as the two took a brief break last week from running the business they'll soon be handing over to new owners Gary and Teresa Massey.

In all their 27 years and no-vacation seasons running the pier, "we never called it going to work — we called it going to fun," Marc said as he and his wife sat at one of the pier picnic tables on a balmy late-winter morning last Friday.

Both Kaplans are familiar faces and Sunset Beach fixtures. For locals and visitors alike, it will definitely be different as they ease their way out of work and look forward to new retirement plans.

But, they're quick to assure, they're leaving both businesses in good hands as they work with the Masseys and new Island Market owners Julia and Dean Gentry in the transition.

"I'm going to be 68 and Becky's going to be 70," Marc said of their approaching retirement. "And we just decided it's time, not mentally or emotionally but physically, it's time."

The Masseys and their "whole family" have been fishing on the pier for at least 25 years.

"They're taking over the pier," Mare said. "It was important to us because we love Sunset Beach. We have loved this place since the first day we came here to visit and definitely since the first time we came to run a business here. It has special meaning to us. We decided that if we're going to leave here, it has to be put in the hands of people that love it like we do."

The Masseys, he said, "are those people."

Last Thursday night, the Kaplans went out to dinner to "celebrate (that) we're unemployed," Marc said as Becky chuckled in the background.

"It was good but it was melancholy at the same time," he said. "But Gary and Teresa have told us we have rights here until we die."

Coming to Sunset Beach

The Kaplans first came to Sunset Beach in 1994 by way of Atlanta, where New York native Marc had been working in the corporate furniture world and Becky, who was bom in Birmingham, Ala., and grew up in Raleigh, worked for the state of Georgia.

Their first season running the pier came in 1995 after pier owners Ed and Dinah Gore handed them the reins.

The Kaplans, who will soon celebrate their 40th wedding anniversary, had met years ago when both lived and worked in Raleigh. They credit their "dear friend" Shirley Shape for eventually leading them to Sunset Beach after she retired here.

"That's how we came here to visit with her and her family," said Marc, who grew up in the Kew Garden Hills neighborhood in Queens, N.Y. "We ended up buying the lot across the street from her and building our first house."

A man Shirley was dating at the time ran the pier.

"He decided he was going to give up the pier," Mare said. He made an appointment with the Gores, meeting them at their beach house on 30th Street. Afterward, Mare was

on his way back to Atlanta

when he got word from Becky

to call Ed Gore when he got home.

"He said if you want (the pier business) it's yours," Mare recalled. "When I met with the two of them, Dinah said, 'If you do this I hope you're as excited next year. The bathrooms are going to be the worst part of it.' And she was right."

They came here without a lease.

"We had been told if Ed Gore gave his word it was as good as any lease," Becky said.

They decided to pull up stakes back during a time when long-term leases were unheard of at the beach. They sold their Georgia house to the first person who looked at it. Then they found a 3,000-square-foot house to rent on the Intracoastal Waterway for \$600 a month. Back in Atlanta, Mare went to the synagogue to consult the rabbit and seek reassurance about why everything seemed to be falling into place.

"He said, 'God has his fingers in your pot and he's stirring it,'" Marc recalled.

"I know who's responsible

for me being here — God," he said. "When all this stuff started happening, when we decided to make this move, we were scared to death. We had never been in business for ourselves."

But they arrived in Sunset Beach with ample experience — Marc's in retail and Becky's in credit. The rest is history as they chart all the people they've med and friends they've made over the years, weathering all kinds of weather and going without a vacation for 27 seasons.

"Through the hurricanes and storms and things that came up, God always took care of us," Marc said.

"When (storms) started in on us, I would go to the end of the pier after we got locked up and battened down and say, 'Do whatcha gotta do, big boy — I know you're going to give me the strength to deal with it,'" Becky said.

"We have such fond memories of all these years," Marc

They consider most of

the "people that came to us extended family," Mare said. "We love them. We have traveled all over the state to funerals with these people."

They've gone to church with them and celebrated autumn when all the fall fishermen come to the pier.

"It takes Becky and I hours to make it to the end of the pier," Mare said. "We're stopping and hugging and kissing everybody. That's what this place has represented to us."

He describes the late Ed Gore, who developed much of Sunset Beach in the footsteps of his dad, Mannon Gore, as "like a second father to me. He died in 2014 and I've mourned his death to this day."

Marc still has a recording on his phone of Ed's last words to him, calling because he hadn't seen Marc in a couple of days.

"As he got off the phone he said, 'I'll talk to you soon. I love you, Marc,'" Kaplan recalled.

"We had just been to his birthday party," Becky said.

When they sought permission from Dinah to retire, she granted it after they assured her they'll still continue to supply her with fish.

"I said, yeah, if anything I'll be able to get you more," said Becky, who loves to fish and go on fishing trips. She does all the catching and cleaning while Mare does the cooking.

Retirement plans

In another week, the
Kaplans plan to take their
first retirement trip to visit
their daughter and grandson
in Phenix City, Ala. Then
they re going to rent a 29-foot
motor home and travel down
to Pensacola, Fla., for a week.
After that, it will be time
celebrate their 40th wedding
anniversary.

On July 3 — the first time the Kaplans have been off in the summer in 27 years — they're taking another Florida motor home trip with family from Jacksonville to the Keys.

"If we like RVing then Becky and I are going to buy one and start RVing — not full time, but as we want to," Mare said. "We want to see our own country. It's beautiful."

Marc, who developed a critical illness and almost died five years ago, said God has given him a gift.

"And the gift was I got to stay here and do something good," he said.

He plans to continue devoting time to his synagogue and serving on the board of Brunswick Community College Foundation.

He and Becky may take off on some more retirement travels, but they said they plan to keep a tochold and presence in their beloved Sunset Beach.

"We're not going to not be a part of it — we're just not going to be owners," Marc said, adding, "I hope in some small way we made an impact on somebody's life, because that's what God expects us to do."
